NAMING OPPORTUNITIES

FIRE & RESCUE HALL NAMING RIGHTS • \$1 MILLION

Tomorrow's Valley Fire & Rescue Hall is a new 33,000 square foot station at 270th and Miegs Streets. The new station will meet today's and tomorrow's needs with 13 bays and drive-through wash bay, with ample storage for apparatus and equipment, as well as training facilities, improved decontamination and restrooms, and administrative space.

TRAINING ROOM & COMMAND CENTER • \$250,000

The meeting room is approximately 60' X 48'. It will serve as a meeting room for the Suburban Board meetings, the training room for the Valley Fire and Rescue Department, and as space for command Central if needed for a catastrophic event. It is designed to accommodate 60 people seated at tables for training.

BAYS • \$75,000 • 13 AVAILABLE

The new Valley Fire Station will house 13 bays for equipment. Six areas are drive through with doors on the east and west to accommodate 12 of the bays and one other bay with a door on the east. The bay area will be a steel framed building equipped with heat and air circulation systems to provide safe and comfortable working conditions for our firefighters. *[Shown below]*

HOSE TOWER • \$50,000

The hose tower is located near the south end of the bays. It is designed to accommodate hoses for drying purposes as well as firefighter training maneuvers. The hose tower is about 38' tall and can be seen extending above the roof of the maintenance bays. The interior staircase is constructed to serve as a training space.

FITNESS CENTER • \$50,000

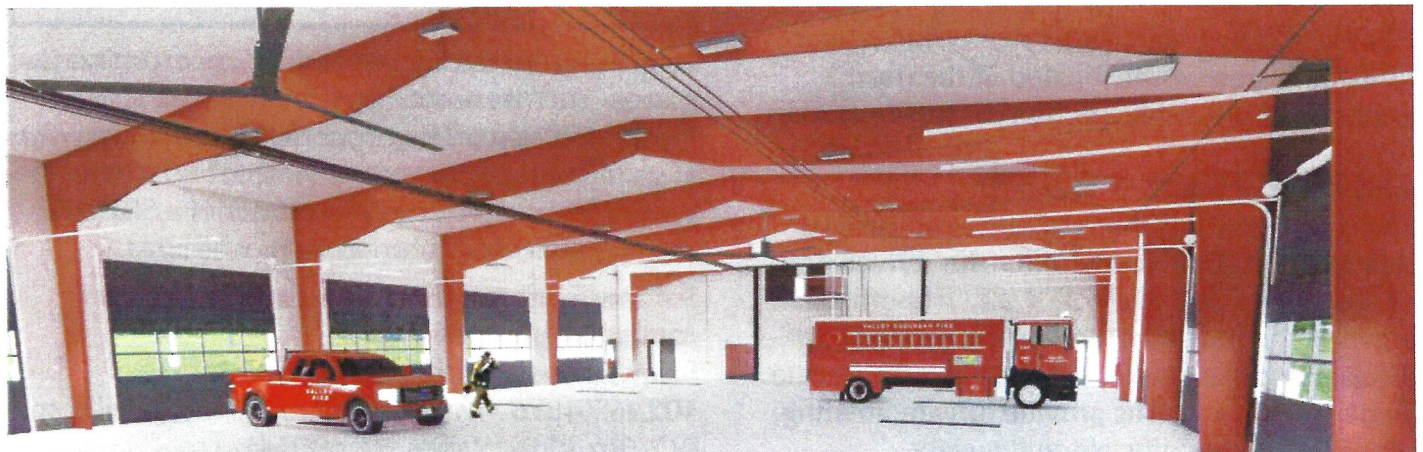
The fitness center is located in the private section of the fire station. It is designed to accommodate the needs of our volunteer firefighters to continue to be in top physical condition to answer the call of our community.

LOBBY • \$50,000

The lobby is located at the north entrance of the fire station as the entrance to the public part of the fire station. It will include entrance to the meeting/training room, public restrooms, and the conference room. This area will include display cabinets to share the department's history and accomplishments.

CONFERENCE ROOM/BOARDROOM

The conference room/boardroom is for conference calls, board meetings, management discussions, and other major decision-making situations.



HELIPAD • \$25,000

A Helipad will be constructed at the southwest end of the fire station. It will be a size appropriate to accommodate life flight helicopters.

WASH BAY • \$25,000

On the far south end of the bays is the wash bay. It is a drive-through bay large enough to accommodate the largest piece of fire department equipment. This space will provide hot water for washing equipment after a call in any kind of weather.

KITCHEN & DAY ROOM • \$25,000

The kitchen & day room are in the private section of the building. The use of these rooms is intended for fire fighters who are "on duty" or in need of a meal or break during activities, after calls, or catastrophic events.

TOOL/WORKROOM • \$25,000

The Tool/Workroom is located in the private section of the fire station. It is intended to store tools and provide workspace for firefighters to keep up with daily repairs on equipment and within the building.

WARMING ROOM • \$25,000

The warming room is accessible through the meeting room. It is designed to be used as a space to keep food warm to be used at an event in the meeting/training room.

BUNKER GEAR LOCKER ROOM • \$25,000

The Bunker Gear Locker Room is located on the north end of the bays. It is designed to accommodate enough lockers so each volunteer firefighter will have an easily accessible locker for their bunker gear.

FLAGPOLE • \$15,000

A flagpole area will be located at the north entrance of the public section of the fire station.

CHIEF'S OFFICE • \$15,000

The chief's office is the first office on the east side of the station as you enter the private part of the fire station. It is 9'2" X 22'. This office will serve as the headquarters for the acting chief to plan, organize and direct the Fire and Rescue Department as well as provide private meeting space for visiting officials and guests.



REPORT ROOM • \$15,000

The report room is used by the firefighters to complete each call with a detailed report of the call including a list of the firefighters, EMTs, or paramedics on that call. [Shown above]

DECONTAMINATION ROOM • \$15,000

The decontamination room is located next to the bunker gear locker room. It will house specialized equipment to wash and hang dry any bunker gear worn while fighting a fire. This is especially important for the health of our firefighters as well as extending the life of their gear.

LAUNDRY • \$15,000

The laundry area is located on the second floor. Its intended use is for bedding and clothing for those volunteers who may be spending the night.

QUIET SPACE • \$10,000 • 3 REMAINING

Quiet and sleeping rooms on the second floor will provide respite facilities in times of emergencies. There will be four of them completed now with space for four additional rooms if future needs are required. Each room will be furnished with a bed, desk and chair to provide respite space as well as a space to study.

In addition to traditional naming opportunities for spaces such as rooms, bays, and training space, the station also offers opportunities to underwrite a variety of training and equipment initiatives. The Valley Fire and Rescue Department is a 501(c)3 and is grateful for contributions of all sizes.
